April Armstrong is associate dean of clinical research at Keck School of Medicine at the University of Southern California. She also is the director of clinical research for the Southern California Clinical and Translational Research Institute. In the Department of Dermatology at the University of Southern California, she serves as vice chair, director of clinical trials and outcomes research, and director of the psoriasis program. For her research focus, Dr. Armstrong is particularly interested in the appropriate use of systemic agents, comparative effectiveness research,

technology-enabled healthcare delivery, and comorbidities associated with inflammatory skin diseases. She is a federally funded investigator with extensive clinical trial experience, having led or collaborated on more than 120 studies. She has authored more than 150 peer-reviewed scientific publications and has been an editor for the top pharmacology textbook Principles of Pharmacology.

Dr. Armstrong has held multiple leadership positions at professional societies and has been part of the editorial boards of JAMA Dermatology, Journal of the American Academy of Dermatology, and Telemedicine and eHealth. She is a past president of Sacramento Valley Dermatologic Society.

Dr. Armstrong obtained her medical degree from Harvard Medical School and completed her dermatology residency at the Harvard Dermatology Residency Program. She also obtained a Master of Public Health degree from Harvard School of Public Health.
