



Mari Løset, MD PhD

Dr. Mari Løset is a consultant in the Department of Dermatology at St. Olavs Hospital, Trondheim University Hospital, and a researcher at the Norwegian University of Science and Technology (NTNU) in Trondheim, Norway. Her research focuses on population-based data and biobanks, including multi-omic analyses, to improve clinical care for individuals with inflammatory skin diseases. She is actively involved in international research consortia, including the Skin Genetics Consortium.

Dr. Mari Løset is a consultant dermatologist at the Department of Dermatology, St. Olavs Hospital, Trondheim University Hospital, and a researcher at the Norwegian University of Science and Technology (NTNU) in Trondheim, Norway. She leads the Dermatogenomics group at the HUNT Center for Molecular and Clinical Epidemiology, where she integrates genetic, transcriptomic, proteomic, and metabolomic data from blood and tissue samples collected from both population-based and local biobanks to investigate regulatory mechanisms underlying health and disease. This work aims to identify key biological pathways involved in the development and progression of psoriasis and related inflammatory skin diseases, to improve prevention, diagnosis, and treatment strategies.

Dr. Løset is actively involved in several international research collaborations, including the Skin Genetics Consortium. She has recently joined the EuroGuiDerm Psoriasis Guideline Group and serves as the national coordinator for the Global Psoriasis Atlas (GPA). Through her combined roles as clinician and scientist, her overarching aim is to translate molecular insights into improved, patient-centred care.
